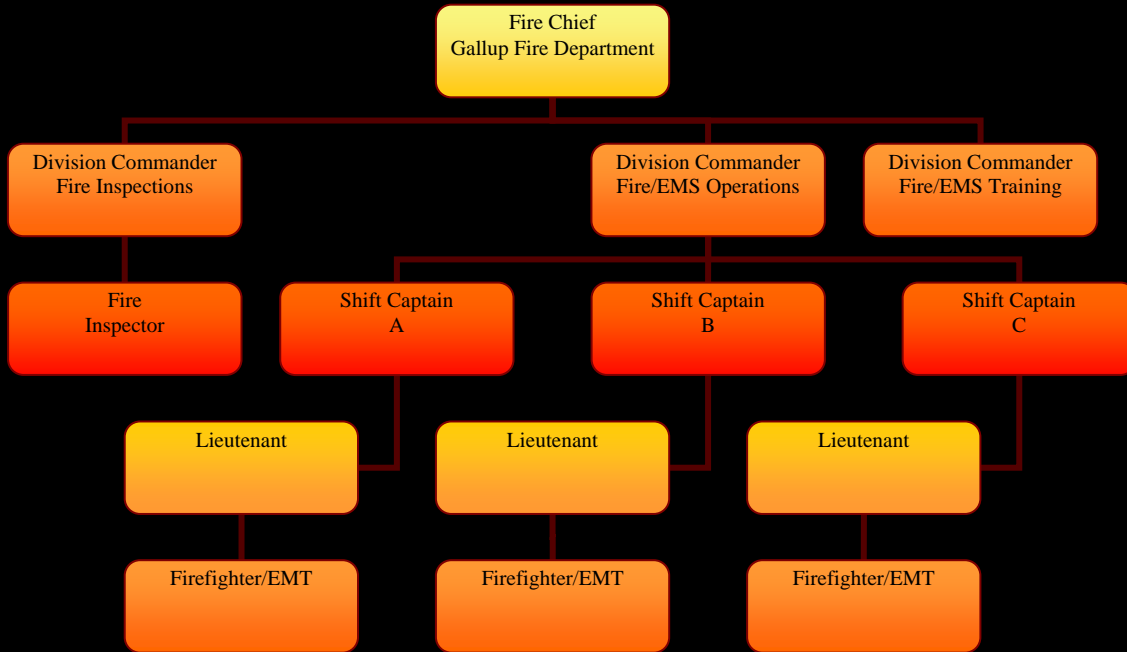


# GALLUP FIRE DEPARTMENT CHAIN OF COMMAND



The Gallup Fire Department provides a wide range of services for the City of Gallup and surrounding areas including but not limited to: emergency medical services, structural and wild land firefighting, Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting, fire prevention and inspection, code enforcement, hazardous materials, high angle rescue, CPR and first aid training, and public education. Gallup fire fighters also perform voluntary blood pressure and blood glucose level checks for the senior citizens centers and stand by at many local events for medical coverage.

Resources of The Gallup Fire Department include: 5 fire stations, 45 uniformed fire fighters including 3 lieutenants and 3 shift captains. Fire department administration consists of 3 division commanders, 1 fire inspector, 1 secretary, and the Chief of the Gallup Fire Department. Fire department apparatus include: 5 fire engines, 2 ladder trucks, 2 medical rescues, 2 brush trucks, 1 airport crash truck, and one hazardous materials trailer.

The Gallup Fire Department responds to over 4000 calls for help a year. All engines, medical rescues, and ladder companies are equipped to provide emergency medical care. All Gallup firefighters are trained to the level of Emergency Medical Technician–Basic, firefighter I, driver/engineer, and hazardous materials-operations. In addition, many firefighters are also trained to the level of Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate, firefighter II, hazardous materials-technician, and are also trained fire instructors, EMT instructors, and CPR instructors. Currently there are no paramedic level fire fighters within the Gallup Fire Department
